Get Involved!! Upcoming Election

The Board of Directors election is coming in April. Please consider joining the BOD. Let us know if you have questions regarding what is required if you wish to help the community by serving on the board.

The bylaws on our <u>web site</u> show the detailed requirements and duties of directors and office holders (President, Vice President, Treasurer, and Secretary). If you choose to become a director, you will have to attend about 11 meetings a year (under an hour). You will also have to occasionally contribute some of your time addressing issues outside of meetings. Of course, BOD officers have additional responsibilities outside of the meetings.

Other ways to get involved:

Please attend the community meetings, especially the annual meetings (April Board of Director election and October Budget Presentation meetings).

We need additional people to help with Committees. We have not been able to get a Social Committee started despite interest. The Beautification Committee needs occasional help with the community projects (such as planting the islands and Christina Parkway fence area). Helping with these and other projects helps our community funds go further.

Projects Planned for 2024:

The budget has an allocation to complete additional planting by the fence along Christina Pkwy and complete fence repairs as needed. Please contact Mike Powell if you can help with these projects (or help watering the plants after we get the new ones installed). Reminder on Estoppel Fees: The BOD has approved a fee for estoppel letters as allowed under Florida law. For refinance letter requests and home sales letter requests, we will charge a \$250 fee for non-members and Class B members. **Class A members (dues paid) will not be charged a fee.** Another benefit of HOA membership!

Other Reminders:

Please do not put yard waste in the medians or islands. Polk County only picks up yard waste from residences (for free) and will not pick up from non-resident properties. In that case, we must pay someone else to haul away the debris at an extra cost to us. It would be helpful if you find some debris in the road or medians after storms, etc., place it in your yard for pickup. That will make your dues money go further. Updates on Financial Sustainability

We have communicated previously about the rapidly shrinking reserve fund the Association has in place. Our plan is to set up a new, greatly reduced cost maintenance plan for the side road islands (not the Christina Blvd and Christina Pkwy medians maintained by CMIC). There are 21 islands in total, but only 2 have any significant routine maintenance requirements (grass mowing). We hope to hire a nearby homeowner willing to do the mowing once a month or find a mowing company willing to do the work on a monthly schedule. Most mowing companies will only bid weekly schedules as there is little cost reduction to moving to a bi-weekly or monthly schedule.

These are the areas we are looking for a new mowing plan (either a homeowner or someone who will mow, trim, and clean debris as needed):

- 1) The largest island is on Cedar Ln (we call it island 21).
- 2) The second largest island requiring mowing is the loop Shadow Circle (island 20).
- 3) There is a tiny island on Woodside Dr near Christina Blvd (island 18).

The remainder of the islands are primarily mulch covered and require less maintenance. We plan to rely on volunteer workdays to maintain them.

We need to take this step before we run out of funds and are unable to fund the other financial commitments of the Association. If we do not make a change in what we spend to maintain the common areas, we are going to be in a predicament in about 3 years when our reserves are used up.

Ideally, we will get more people contributing via membership dues. If we cannot come up with funds or a limited maintenance plan, it will be up to the neighbors to maintain those areas. Since it is county property, the county should mow a couple of times per year if requested. Although it is possible to raise dues (which has not been done for a <u>very</u> long time), only about a third of the homes currently contribute dues, so it would not be fair to ask more from the people who already contribute. Our maintenance and insurance costs have gone up considerably in the last 3 years.

Notes on Polk County Recycling

As you are probably aware, Polk County will no longer be collecting recycling materials this coming October. Before they stop collection, you can do your part to help the county avoid the costs related to not recycling correctly.

The county does not have its own sorting center, so it has to pay to ship it to Gainesville for sorting / separating. The county has been paying additional fees if the material they send is less than 50% usable materials. When the county collects recycling materials, it makes a judgement each day as to whether more than half of the items collected are good materials or not. If it looks like it is not over 50%, the entire load is put in the landfill. It does not matter how well you follow the rules, if your neighbor is not following the rules, everything ends up in the landfill instead of being recycled.

Important tips:

- 1) **Do not put your materials in a garbage bag.** All bags of materials are landfilled without even being opened by the sorting facility.
- 2) Do not let the paper and cardboard get wet. Wet materials cannot be sold.
- 3) Ensure only acceptable materials are put in the bins. The only plastic acceptable is #2 translucent (such as milk jugs). No other plastic is acceptable.
 - a. Aluminum cans
 - b. Steel (tin) cans or containers
 - c. Cardboard, cereal boxes, cardboard egg cartons
 - d. Newspaper, uncoated paper, paper products
 - e. Most gallon and half gallon, translucent plastics (no colored or clear plastics), milk, juice, or water jugs
- 4) If you are unsure if something is recyclable or not, put it in the trash bin.

The statistic from the county is that less than half the households even put out recycling, and only 10% of those do it correctly. The end result is that it costs the county much more to process recycling than it generates in revenue. Also, there is not much of a market for recycled materials in Florida, as the transportation costs to get the materials to the buyers means it is not economically feasible to continue.

Notes on Yard Waste Collection

The county changed the rules recently on yard waste collection. Yard waste must be in containers, bags, or bundles. Four containers / bundles / bags maximum. They should weigh less than 30 lbs. each. Branches must be less than 3 ft in length and 2 inches in diameter. Loose material should not be put out for pickup. So far, they have been picking up non-complaint households, but that will change soon. FYI: The yard waste collected is used to cover the working section of the landfill each night.
